Regular Meetups Over Summer and going forward!

Our regular meet ups continued over the summer. Details of all of these are on our website and on Meetup. It is really helpful to register on Meetup if possible as this has visibility and encourages others to come along. You can of course also register through our website.

For the Thinking Out Loud and Monthly Discussions, spaces are quite limited so it is very useful if you can register if you're attending.

Social meet ups at the Pied Bull in Chester continue to offer a relaxed and easy way to connect and enjoy conversations and catch ups on a range of topics. These social evenings are held on the third Tuesday each month starting @ 7 pm.

The **Thinking Out Loud** guided reading sessions continue apace – the group is nearing the conclusion of Nathaniel Hawthorne's The Scarlet Letter – it has proven a

bountiful source of topic for discussions. The sessions take place at Storyhouse on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Thursday each month (10.00 am. To 12 midday)

The **monthly discussions** have also continued.

These started in June 2024 when we met up in the Pied Bull pre-general election to discuss what we wanted from politics – the world has certainly changed politically since then but perhaps the things we all want haven't so much?

We moved to a regular slot at Storyhouse and hold discussions on the evening of the first Monday of each month.

Topics have included, How we judge the past – Is it the Art or the Artist that's important Do we have a special relationship with the U.S.A? Are manners important? Do we have free-speech? Do we have Free Will? How does generational influence work today? Is AI a Liberator or Gaoler? The effect of Patriarchy on Women today.

Ruthun Walk and Talk - 14th September 2025

Sunday 14th September RHUTHUN FIELD TRIP – CAEL TAITH MAES

Meet at 10.30 am, Park Road Car Park, LL15 1EB, What3Words counts.usual.clenching £4 all day.

From Mold take the A494 to Rhuthun. On entering Rhuthun (beware 20 mph speed limits!) At the first large roundabout (Tesco corner) take the 3rd exit along Park Road, the car park is 500m on the left immediately before the Texaco petrol station.



Join us for a gentle historical stroll around the beautiful hilly town of Rhuthun, North Wales, 24 miles from Chester. You will find many original timbered buildings dating from the 15th century. Nant Clwyd Y Dre House has parts Mediaeval, Jacobean and Georgian!

Explore secret alleyways, footpaths and Ruthin Castle, where we stop for refreshments after exploring the old castle ruins built by Edward the 1st. Find the `Maen Huail Stone`, according to legend where King Arthur beheaded Huail, his rival in love and war.

Turn around to the Old Courthouse where you will see remains of the Gibbet where Friar and religious dissident Charles Mahoney was executed in 1679. Only 152 years later, Charles Darwin stayed here at the Castle Hotel.

We then walk across Cae Ddol fields, where we can kick our heels along the shingly banks of the Afon Clwyd, This is where our walk concludes. Those who want to stay on, we will then visit Ruthin Gaol! A Pentonville style prison, open to visitors (£9 for adults). Or walk back into town for an afternoon on the square and perhaps a visit to a local pub.

The walk should take 2.5 to 3 hours.. depending how long we stay taking refreshments at the castle or looking for Peachicks and ghosts!

Gardening: The group maintains a garden area in Grosvenor Park and there are meetups in Grosvenor Park – usually arranged through the gardening sub-group on WhatsApp. The small circular bed contributes in a small way to the enjoyment of visitors to the park. Gardeners share good conversation with people walking through admiring the blooms and the work. There is a separate working group page within our WhatsApp community. The gardening sessions are a lovely way to meet up – we invariably go to enjoy a hot or cold beverage and sometimes a slice of cake!
